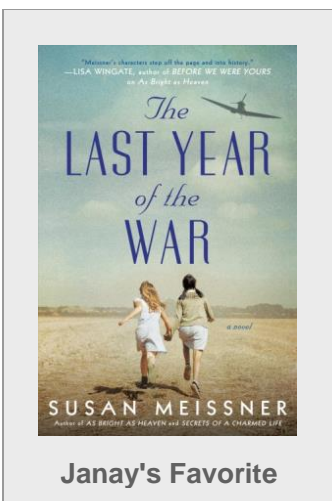

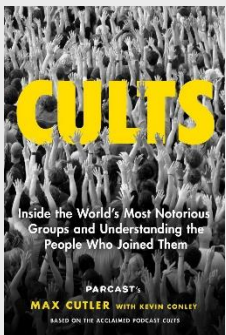

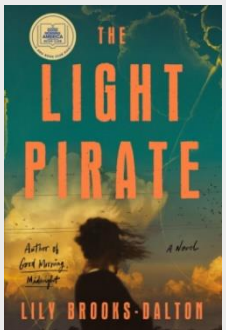

- 4) An Open Mic time for the public to share their poems



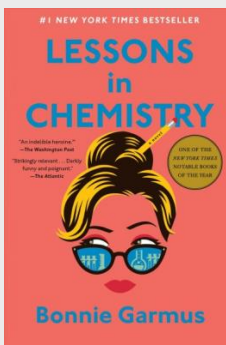

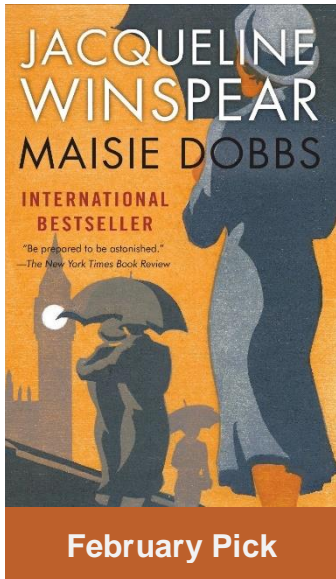
We challenge businesses and groups to get involved with Winter Carnival and to construct snowmen out of any materials they chose except real snow.

We have selected 54 prompts to read for the list. The list is available at the library or we have this [downloadable version](#).

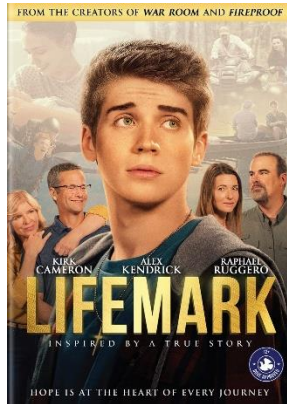
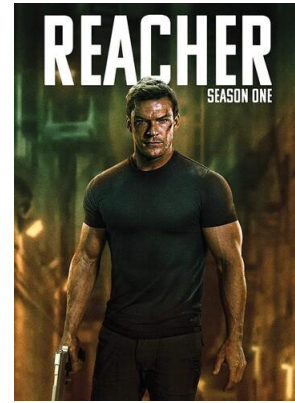
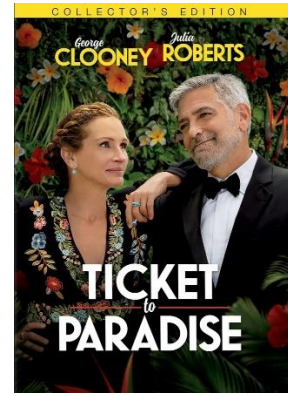
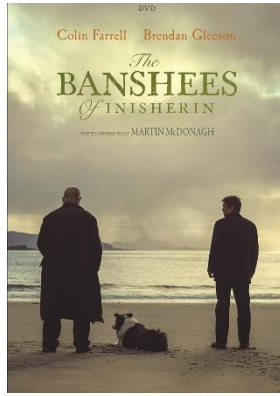
